REGULAR CITY COUNCIL – MINUTES

Mayor Scott Burton called the regular City Council Meeting to order on August 26, 2013 at Clinton City Hall at 5:30 pm. Councilman Larry Gann, Councilman Rob Herrell, Councilman Jim McBride, Councilman Charlie Lyons, Councilman Jerry Shattuck, Councilman E.T. Stamey were present.

Prayer was led by Councilman Larry Gann followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Councilman Jim McBride made a motion to approve the agenda and seconded by Councilman Jerry Shattuck. Motion carried.

Councilman Charlie Lyons made a motion to approve the July 22, 2013 minutes, seconded by Councilman E.T. Stamey. Motion carried.

RECOGNITION OF VISITORS AND CITIZENS

Mayor Burton asked for any comments/concerns from the citizens. Leon Jacquet requested permission to close Market Street to host the annual Veterans Day Parade, November 11th at 6pm. Councilman Jerry Shattuck made the motion to approve and second made by Councilman Rob Herrell. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

School Board Report

Dr. Violet reported that the South Clinton repair project was almost complete and school was delayed one day. She stated that the project ran over their projected cost of \$717,000 to complete. Originally the schools added an additional \$116,000 to that figure for capital projects at the other 2 schools which brought the total amount of \$833,000 for capital outlay projects. The formal bid from Studio Four came in at \$804,400 which put the cost over \$90,000 so the schools changed some of the capital projects at the other two schools around to absorb some of the cost and was still over about \$60,000. Dr. Violet stated that they plan to use some of their Fund Balance to cover the cost and thought the School Board would vote to do so.

She reported on the TCAP scores and stated out of 140 school districts in Tennessee, Clinton City Schools ranked in the top ten in all four categories. Also, Clinton City Schools was ranked 169 out of 1700 schools and was chosen as a "Reward School", schools that rank in the top 5%, for the second year in a row.

Dr. Violet reiterated the Schools need for \$20,000 to go towards a computer lab for Clinton Elementary and the asked Council for their monetary support. Her request for funding was denied for lack of a motion.

Dale Isabell presented the school financial report.

Board of Zoning Appeals

Councilman Larry Gann reported the Board met on August 12, 2013. There was new business to conduct.
