Councilman Rob Herrell made a motion to approve the agenda and seconded by Councilman Larry Gann. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

City School Board Report

Ms. Johnson thanked Chief Scarbrough for his support and work with the SRO program. Ms. Johnson shared the TN Ready results just at the district levels stating it was cause to celebrate. She discussed the City schools ranking in the top 5 districts, not only in achievement but also in growth. Ms. Johnson recognized and congratulated several teachers and staff for their hard work and dedication to their students for these accomplishments.

Scott Rhea presented the school finance report and requested approval of budget amendment no. 8. Councilman Rob Herrell made the motion to approve amendment no. 8 and seconded by Councilman E.T. Stamey. Motion approved unanimously by roll call vote.

Clinton Board of Zoning Report

Councilman Larry Gann stated that the Board met July 9, 2018. Applicant Quality Inn request for administrative review for directional signage was deferred to the August meeting by applicant.

Applicant Danny Holt request for a rear setback variance from 25 ft. to 16.3 ft. and front setback variance from 30 ft. to 21 ft. for property located at 606 Eagle Bend Road was approved.

Request from applicant Derek and Kyle Keeton for parking lot variance setback for property located at 139 S. Charles Seivers Blvd. was withdrawn by applicant.

Clinton Regional Planning Commission

Councilman Larry Gann stated that the Board met July 9, 2018. Applicant Fred Seiber request for B-2 rezoning for property located on Carden Farm Drive was not recommended in favor of the rezoning request and forwarded to city council.

Clinton Utilities Board Report

Councilman Zach Farrar presented the CUB report.

OTHER BOARD & COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Larry Gann announced a Celebration of Induction as a state Museum for Green McAdoo Cultural Center will be held on August 25th at 10:00 am..

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

City Manager Houck stated that the City had been notified by the Tennessee Department of Transportation's selection of our proposal for funding under the federal Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement (CMAQ) program. The Clinton Traffic Signalization Improvements Phase I project will provide \$150,000.00 in federal funding assistance to inventory the signal system, collect traffic data, assess signal system operation and propose, implement, and evaluate new signal timing. The results from this phase of the project will influence further project phases for improvements/implementation.

He continued stating the Fire Department received a grant from Firehouse Subs for \$9,750.00 which will purchase AED's for all 7 firetrucks.

Gail Cook presented the financial report.

City Manager Houck reported that last year the city started utilizing the Anderson County Animal Care and Control holding facility on Blockhouse Valley Road to provide an additional outlet for impounded animals when the Oak Ridge Animal Shelter is at or over capacity for holding space. We executed an operational agreement with Anderson County for the use of their facility and services which must be renewed on an annual basis. He recommended approval of the Memorandum of Understanding for Animal Control with Anderson County, for the period July 1, 2018 – June 30, 2019. Councilman E.T. Stamey made the motion to approve and seconded by Councilman Larry Gann. Motion carried.

NEW RESOLUTIONS AND ORDINANCES


First Reading of New Ordinances

CAFE FUND:

The recommended Budget Amendment in Café Fund increases appropriations by \$30,500; which is funded by an increase in revenues.

WHEREAS, under Rick's leadership, the Clinton Police Department has received several awards including the 2014 University of Tennessee MTAS Excellence in Police Services Award and in 2017 the Department received its first ever state accreditation, and;

WHEREAS, the leadership, staff and citizens of our city will miss the professionalism, character, and vision that Rick has brought to the Clinton Police Department, and;

NOW THEREFORE, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Clinton wish to thank Rick Scarbrough for his years of service to the City of Clinton and for his dedication and loyal service to the citizens of our community and wish him great success in his new position as Executive Director of the University of Tennessee's Law Enforcement Innovation Center.
